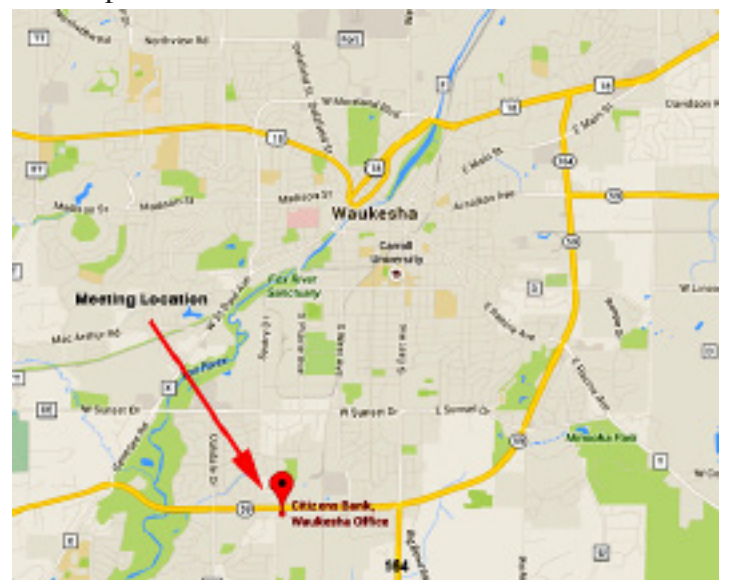

To be an amateur means to be a lover. Professional or not, I want to do this for the rest of my life as an amateur.
